9:45 – Financial Aid Debt Letter and Early Non-Payment Drops

Tracy Ireland, Associate Vice Chancellor for Student Enrollment Services, USG

- Topic 1: Know More. Borrow Less.

- What issues trying to solve. Low income students accepted into college never enroll because of federal aid complexity; award letter is not consistent, clear and understandable; student aid process varies greatly from campus to campus

- What will KMBL accomplish - Streamline the FAFSA verification process; standardize the student aid experience; take the information to where students are; help students understand monthly debt payments upon graduation; educating students and families about sound borrowing principles, including borrowing what is necessary rather than the maximum amount available

- KMBL Deployed Features – CampusLogic Student Form: Streamlining FAFSA verification; 26 institutions doing the financial aid process the same way; personalized; mobile ready; debt notices to students where they are; details of amount borrowed to date; clearly explain monthly payment amounts and loan costs; and real-time data insight into usage of all CampusLogic campuses. Data showed most students reviewed information between 2pm and 4pm.

- Digital student financial plan notice – school advisory group formed; initial form design in process; IT is developing data extraction; upcoming training and announcements; video content procured with Ocelot (formerly FATV).

Implementation schedule: Aug 26- kickoff – Sept- design; Oct 2019- development and training; student financial plan to be released Nov-Dec 2019; Chatbot service (12 – 18 months)

-Topic 2: Early Non-payment Drop – Many schools are doing this to figure who is going to come. This may not be good for all schools - optional.

-Floor discussion:

-BoR - If you have payment deadlines that are not widely enforced, it makes it difficult to run effective processes.

-Question: Do we have flexibility with the final payment drop process? How to get everyone on the same page? (BoR – These requirements are very clear. The BOR's policy – fee payment deadline is the last day of drop/add.)

-Question: By show of hands, how many schools are following this? Varied.

-Question: How many schools' payment deadlines coincide with the day their Financial Aid Offices disburse aid?

Jonathan Hull:

- MATH 1401: STAT 1401 (15 schools +/- in the pilot)
- Slides from Jonathan Hull
- Reside in A (also allowed in D still)
- What programs / pathways will allow this for the Area A
- Advising Component: Need to have discussion about how this fits into each program of study. Has had discussions with the specific RAC's about best fit and many said it would work.
- May need an alternative area D course for pathways that use this for A.
- Because Area A - there will be a possible learning support component. Oct 11 is the workshop to develop the coreq.
- Columbus state is doing pilot for the Spring 20. Others are launching for Fall 20.
- Placement for the course will follow 1101 / 1001 - NOT college Algebra.
- Banner and DW issues need to be addressed.
- Reviewed Timeline....
 - May 19 - Announced
 - Fall 19 - Allowed to enroll using it as area A - but don't know if anyone is doing this
 - Nov 19 - Shared pathways as submitted to USG
 - Dec 19 - Check in with institutions / pilots
 - Jun 20 - coreq Stat.....see slides for more details

Questions:

Implementations are Institutionally Specific?

- Yes - sort of.....aside from STEM there is not supposed to be a required A2 math to some extent. This is unless one of the A2 courses are a prerequisite for the next level coursework in the pathway / major.
- For pilots they will need to make sure it is updated in the catalog? YES
- Is there a timeline for the pilot? NO - presently the pilot is not on a timeline at all. Do not know when plan is for this to become official Board policy.
- Grade Mode questions.....should we continue using 6/7/8 with the %? YES - they should stay in place. There should NOT be Pass / Fail models in place anymore. This was specifically done to help increase the engagement and ensure students were taking their courses seriously.

10:30 – General Education Redesign and Reverse Transfer

Barbara Brown:

- General Education Redesign:
- WHY? Core purpose not clear to students. Too much checkbox mentality. Want to be able to tailor to institutional missions more effectively.

- Another site with principles available.
- Barbara's crystal ball....

- Will NOT likely include area A - E mentality.
- Committee being developed - but not clear on the outcome. Looking at 42 hours.
- Still expected to have 60 transferrable hours - even with only 42 hour core.
- Likely to include 18 hours of prep for area F / maybe Free electives.
- May place more emphasis on common numbered courses
- Much discussion about timeline to implementation - Dr. Denley is still talking about Fall 2020. Several asked for Fall 2021.
- Reverse Transfer: May be option to work with Clearinghouse. She does not think it will be less labor intensive side.
- Wants to start new System wide effort.
- Wants volunteers of Registrars
- Who would LIKE to participate - NOT be told.
- We can do RT for out of state institutions now. IF we are willing to take on the workload.
